## Curriculum links

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**Science:** investigating the local environment and using findings to inform actions to care for it; using the local environment throughout the year to explore and answer questions about animals in their habitat - Identifying that most living things live in habitats to which they are suited, describing how different habitats provide for the basic needs of different kinds of animals and plants, and how they depend on each other.

**Geographical and social:** developing knowledge about the UK and the wider world.
